





The Phelan Decision

It is important to understand that the Phelan decision is not the definitive decision. The findings have yet to be tested and upheld by the Supreme Court of Canada. Until such a time, there are no general or special "rights" for Métis peoples and membership status provided by any organization must not be confused with the privileges that have been granted to official First Nations peoples.


